On behalf of Murray Farm Public School P&C, I am thrilled to express our gratitude for another successful year. Reflecting on our achievements, it's clear that 2023 stands out as a year of significant contributions and initiatives, positively impacting our students and school community.

We kicked off the year with the introduction of the Volunteer Reward Program, a testament to our dedication to engaging more parents in school events. This program, costing \$150, has been pivotal in recognizing and encouraging the active participation of our parent volunteers.

Our commitment to education shone through with an \$8,000 donation to the school library, enhancing the students' reading program.

The Gardening Club initiative continued to flourish, creating a thriving green space for our students. This project not only beautifies our school grounds but also instills a sense of environmental stewardship in our students.

The School Community Support Initiative, though yet to receive applications, stands ready to assist families facing unforeseen challenges. This initiative underscores our commitment to the well-being of our entire school community and will be a long-term initiative to help our families.

Our P&C Logo Design Competition was a highlight, involving our community in a creative endeavor to define our collective identity. The result was a new logo, inspired by the creativity of three talented and lovely Murray Farm students, now proudly representing our school P&C.

Our BBQ Election Day Fundraisers were resounding successes, held twice this year. In March, Cecile's leadership raised \$2,690, and in October, our student-led event added another \$1,388.20 to our funds. These events not only raised substantial funds but also showcased the dedication and skills of our students and community.

The launch of our P&C website in July, <u>murrayfarmpnc.com.au</u>, marks a milestone in our efforts towards a more connected and transparent community. Thanks to Shirley, our IT coordinator, parents now have a central hub for all P&C information, including involvement opportunities and multi-lingual meeting support, catering to our diverse community.



A significant financial decision this year was the establishment of a 6-month term deposit of \$200,000 in October, at a 4.83% annual interest rate. This strategic move aims to generate additional income of \$4,830 for next year's funding.

Continuing our tradition of enhancing community engagement and student support, 2023 was a year of impactful initiatives at Murray Farm Public School.

The Class Parent Scheme fostered connections among parents, and the Year 6 Farewell project was a touching celebration of the remarkable journeys of our students. The Murray Farm Cracker Carnival, held on September 16, 2023, was a highlight event, showcasing the vibrant spirit of our school. Additionally, the Parent Masterclass initiative, which involved coordinating guest speaker programs in collaboration with the Principal, significantly enriched our educational offerings.

This year, our P&C experienced an unprecedented surge in participation, with membership reaching a record high of 124. This remarkable increase signifies a growing enthusiasm and commitment within our community, greatly contributing to the vibrancy and success of our school's initiatives.

Canteen - from Sophia Kim

The canteen has 3 managers, 2 supervisors and 4 relief supervisors along with a dedicated team of regular volunteers. Our lovely Gaye retired after 12 years of service.

The P&C created a new website allowing volunteers to sign up online for the first time.

The canteen successfully provided over 1000 recess and lunch orders on International Food Day.

The P&C supplied thank you ice block vouchers to parent volunteers of the school-which were very much appreciated by the children who enjoyed the reward!

We trialed a different Chinese Food supplier whilst Carmen Drive Chinese restaurant underwent renovations.

We bought a new fridge and a new oven and added new laptop to process orders more efficiently.

Food Safety Supervisor certificates have been completed for the three managers for compliance with the new legislation which exceeds the requirement.

New food menu items were trialed (frozen grapes/ strawberries and more to come!). A huge thank you to the wonderful staff at the canteen and all the amazing volunteers. Onwards and upwards for 2024!

As P&C Events Co-ordinator, and with the Events Crew, we've supported the following successful Events: Swimming Carnival, Athletics Carnival, Open Day, Mother's Day Stall, Character Dress Up Parade/Book Week, Father's Day Stall,
